A Fire Mock Drill and Fire Safety Awareness Program was conducted at the institute in collaboration with Expert Security Services and the Fire and Security Association of India (FSAI) – Pune Chapter. The initiative aimed to promote fire safety awareness and enhance emergency preparedness among students, faculty, and support staff, with a total of 130 participants (51 students and 79 faculty and support staff).




The session was led by Mr. Deepak Dorik (EHS Consultant and CW Member, FSAI Pune Chapter), Mr. Raturaj Kulkarni (Sustainability Consultant, Academician, and Principal Architect at RBK Architects), and Mr. Shivam (Fire Safety Professional, Partner at FireChamps, and Digital Content Creator).

The program began with an informative session that provided participants with a clear understanding of fire hazards, preventive measures, and appropriate responses during emergency situations. The importance of staying calm, alert, and following proper safety protocols was emphasized throughout the session.

This was followed by a practical demonstration, where participants were trained in the correct use of firefighting equipment such as fire extinguishers, hydrants, and hoses. The experts explained different types of fires and demonstrated suitable techniques to control them effectively. The session also covered evacuation procedures and highlighted the importance of coordinated efforts during emergencies.

The program played a significant role in building awareness, confidence, and a sense of responsibility among participants. It helped them understand how to act promptly and efficiently in case of a fire-related incident, thereby contributing to overall campus safety.

Overall, the session was highly informative and engaging. The active participation of students and staff made the program successful and impactful. Such initiatives are essential in fostering a culture of safety and preparedness within the institution.
